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# SUPPORTING SITUATIONAL UNDERSTANDING

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Selecting which parts of information are important in a picture or in a situation can be a tricky skill to learn.

Activities that can help a student learn to focus and look at whole situations are:

Spot the difference puzzles

Search and find books like 'Where's wally'.

Asking them to recall what has happened in a TV show or cartoon.

Asking them to look at pictures in magazines and work out what is happening. To do this, use questions like 'why do you think that?' And 'How can you tell?' to get them to back up their answers with evidence.
